Report of Student Feedback Analysis (2021-2022)

Sitananda College, Nandigram being unique from its very inception and foundation, has emerged as a benchmark of excellence and its goal is to provide quality education and prepare students as competent members of society and as a whole. With quality sustenance as its focus, the IQAC of the college has developed the feedback mechanism commencing with obtaining feedback from the various students through a structured rating-based feedback form. The feedback has been generated through a comprehensive perspective of including several parameters of the Teaching-Learning-Evaluation and the Overall Academic experience of the students. These parameters are Academic Governance, Teaching-learning and Evaluation, IT infrastructural Facilities, Availability of Physical Resources, and Other Outdoor Activities. These Parameters have several statements each and have to be graded on a 5-point scale. The feedback was graded on a 5-point scale (Strongly Agree-5, Agree-4, Neutral-3, Disagree-2, and Strongly Disagree-1) and is presented below. The college has drawn feedback from students for continuous improvement in curriculum development and enrichment. For the session 2021-2022, the analysis of students' feedback is presented as under:




Figure:1 Academic Governance








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Figure; 4 Availability of Physical Resources

Major Observations

All the students participated and gave their valuable responses towards all the parameters and the statements relating to the same and which in turn presents very favourable feedback, although there is a scope for improvement.

In terms of Academic Governance, the feedback report presented a strong aspect of a free & clean academic environment with good connections between students- teachers, and other administrative members of the academic circle. Such kind of academic friendly environment helps students to secure a good academic record and provides a long way for the necessary development of the institution. However, as per the recorded data still, there is some gap in the academic perspective of the college that could be attributed due to the Covid-19 pandemic as face-to-face interaction and lacking physical classes.

With respect to the teaching-learning process and evaluation pattern, it could be confined that it is an important & complementary part of each other as well as the system of education. As per the recorded data, it can be assumed that students are very much satisfied with the pattern of formative assessment and other aspects of teaching. However, in terms of library facilities, and the availability of books there is an urgent need for improvement.

Concerning IT infrastructural facilities, the feedback report depicted that Students are expecting many more technological facilities such as sufficient Physical classrooms, ICT labs, Wi-Fi/Internet facilities, Science labs, and so on. However, the various stakeholders and heads of the institution are tirelessly working on the said issue.



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In terms of availability of Physical resources, the observed data report elicited that there is little scope for filling the gap in the area of outdoor activities such as fieldwork, students' involvement in NSS work, and Health care facilities inside the college campus, and many more. However, favourable feedback reports pertaining to all these parameters could not be neglected.

Recommendations

The feedback although favourable in all four parameters shows that there is scope for improvement in each of the parameters. Based on students' feedback reports there are many ways to go ahead and fill the current thrust area of education. Students' feedback provides kind support and acknowledgment in the quest of making the curriculum more enhancing and enriching bore fruits with an encouraging rating in the academic year 2020-21. Some of the important measures suggested by Students are-

- 1. There is an important need to incorporate the Master degree courses in all subjects.
- 2. There is an urgent need to improve the library accessing facilities with ID cards and provide an adequate amount of books across all the subjects.
- 3. There is also a need to improve the general and IT infrastructural facilities with good electricity & health care facilities.
- 4. There is great demand for the low admission fee.
