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## SITANANDA COLLEGE: A BRIEF HISTORY

In the year 1959 on 24<sup>th</sup> January two persons of Nandigram locality, Kshirod Chandra Maity of Dhanyakhola and Benimadhab Pal of Roynagar circulated a printed Handbill convening a meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 1959 of the local persons interested in education to be assembled at a local High School “Nandigram Brajamohan Tiwary Sikshaniketan”. They expressed their desire in the call that they wish to establish a Degree College at Nandigram for



imparting higher education and like to donate their savings of money for the purpose.

On 26<sup>th</sup> January, 1959 the meeting was held and the two peasants mentioned above donated Rs.

50,000/- each for the establishment of the proposed College. A General Body was formed in the meeting consisting of 53 enthusiastic persons interested in education of the locality and the Hon'ble SDO. The General Body members pledged to contribute Rs. 2/- (Rupees two only) each for making a fund for preliminary works for the establishment of the College.

In the first meeting of the General Body of the proposed Degree College held on 4<sup>th</sup> February, 1959, an interim Governing Body was formed taking SDO of Tamluk Sub-Division as the President and the Sub-Registrar of Nandigram as the Secretary, one Police Officer of Nandigram P.S., three Head-masters of local High Schools, two M.L.A. of Nandigram Assembly Constituency and twelve local gentries.

Afterwards the General Body and interim Governing Body (Ad-hoc) held twelve meetings encouraged and inspired by tremendous enthusiasm of local people. Lands were procured as donation from local people. Constructions were erected to accommodate students in class rooms, teachers' room, laboratories and college office in tiles headed structures. All these were developed with donations of cash, materials and service/labour free of cost from local people.

Finally, on 19<sup>th</sup> July, 1960 the proposed college was accorded affiliation from the University of Calcutta and the Sitananda College; Nandigram began its journey from 21<sup>st</sup> July, 1960. It came under the umbrella of Vidyasagar University from 1985 onwards.

There is an interesting story behind the name of the college. The college got its name 'SITANANDA' from the first part of the name of two principal donors. They are Sitanath Pal, the father of Benimadhab Pal and Ananda Mohan Maity, the father of Kshirode Chandra Maity. 'SITA' of Sitanath Pal and 'ANANDA' of Ananda Mohan Maity are combined together to give a final shape in the name of the college.

The college started functioning initially with two faculties – Arts and Science. Honours courses were introduced in different subjects in different years like Bengali, Mathematics and Political Science in 1966. In 1997 the college got affiliation in History (Hons.). From 2006-2007 session Education and Chemistry Honours courses and from 2008-2009 Physics Honours course have been introduced. General Courses in Education, Bengali, Philosophy, Political

Science, History, English, Sanskrit, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Zoology had been introduced from its inception. Anthropology was introduced from the inception of the college and it is also interesting to note that it is the second Anthropology Department at the Undergraduate level in its history in West Bengal. Botany, Geography and Nutrition have also been introduced. P G Courses in Bengali and Sanskrit have been introduced from the session-2017-18.

At present the college office is fully computerized and automated with Internet facilities. The college has five spacious and well-equipped Blocks – Administrative Block, Arts Block, Science Block, Kazi Nazrul Block and New Science Building (P.G. Section).

Recently, the Reading Rooms (teachers and Students) of the Library have been refurnished with air-condition facilities. There are ten well equipped laboratories, a Museum of Zoology, a Boys' Common Room, a Boys' Hostel, a Girls' Hostel, three Playgrounds, two Ponds with three Pucca Ghats and a Canteen for Teachers and Students.

The college is marching forward with success and glory. Presently, it has more than 1669 students and interestingly, girls comprise of the formidable part of it. The college is gifted with a healthy academic atmosphere fostered and nurtured by teachers, students and management of the institution. Moreover, the scenic beauty of the college with its ponds, plants and gardens provide it with an aesthetic look. Peace and happiness prevail upon the idyllic



ambience of the academia which gives a sensation of ancient *Topovan* to both the teachers and learners. In the past years the college has produced thousands of promising talents who are now playing significant roles in the reconstruction of an ideal society and a strong,

secular and democratic nation. Posterity waits with lighted candles and flowery crowns to welcome the coming days of success towards which the college is steadily marching ahead.

### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION

The goal of this institution is to make quality education and prepare competent students for society – national and international. As an institution of higher education our objective is to inculcate enthusiasm and motivation in the students so that they can discover the right path ahead to elevate their moral values. Our object is also to make the students a responsible citizen who will play constructive role in the building of our nation by learning democratic values, building moral character, developing dignity of human soul and fighting against all sorts of evils, oppression, tyranny and injustice. Our institution is also committed to provide quality education to the students where they can gain integrated subjective knowledge to compete with the modern progressive world of success and glory. All these are reflected well in teaching and overall activities of the institution. The teaching-learning community of the institution is committed to the following aims and objectives:

The motto of the institution, in a nutshell is to discover the immense potentiality of human soul and enrich and apply them to the general good of man and society.

\* Extra Curricular Activities: Cultural Competitions, Participation of students in Essay, Quiz competitions, Outdoor games like Football, Volleyball, Cricket and Badminton in College playgrounds and Indoor Games like Carom, Table Tennis and Chess etc. held in the College Common Rooms. Moreover, Wall Magazines are regularly published.

\* Results: High success rate in the University Examination, very often secures first, second or third position in different subjects, result oriented teaching-learning procedure is strictly followed.

\* N.S.S: Three NSS Units are there in the college. The college has close contact with the common people through the NSS teams.

## INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Every Higher Educational Institution should have an internal quality assurance system with appropriate structure and processes and with enough flexibility to meet the diverse needs of the

stakeholders. The internal quality assurance mechanism of the institution is called “Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC).” IQAC is meant for planning, guiding and monitoring Quality Assurance and Quality Enhancement activities of the Higher Educational Institutions. For the above purposes, our institution established Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on 11.12.2011.

The IQAC assists the Principal in chalking out academic programmes, infrastructural blue prints, and the matters related to the promotion of teachers under CAS (Career Advancement Scheme). The IQAC Coordinator keeps track of all quality related activities of the college and engages in motivating the faculty and students to realize the targets. The IQAC should become a driving force for ushering in quality by working out intervention strategies to remove deficiencies and enhance quality and to meet the diverse needs of the stakeholders and to fulfil the specific objectives of the Cell.

### Functions

- ❖ Dissemination of information on various quality parameters of higher education;
- ❖ Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles;
- ❖ Documentation of the various programmes/activities leading to quality improvement;
- ❖ Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- ❖ Development and maintenance of institutional database through MIS for the purpose of maintaining /enhancing the institutional quality;
- ❖ Development of Quality Culture in the institution;
- ❖ Preparation of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC, to be submitted to NAAC.

## **LIBRARY OF THE COLLEGE**

Library is a store-house of knowledge. Sitananda College Library is located on the First Floor of the Arts Block of the college with an approximate total area of 2000 Sq. ft. The college library started functioning with the very beginning of the college in the year 1960. The library began to flourish to keep pace with the growing academic needs of the students, teachers and scholars. The College Library is fully automated and OPAC services are available for the users. The internet facilities are available in the college library. The library has two spacious Reading Rooms- one for students and other for teachers with all facilities. The Reading Rooms are furnished with Air Condition facilities which will immensely help the readers for study purpose comfortably.

- ❖ **Collection:** The College Library has a collection of more than 20000 books and some current journals. Some of the collections are treated as Reference Collection for consulting in the library only.
- ❖ **Rare Books Section:** The library is also in possession with some rare books in different disciplines.
- ❖ **Membership:** The membership is open to the faculty, students and non-teaching staff of the institution.

**Reference Services:** The library has a separate reference collection consisting of fact tools such as encyclopaedias, dictionaries, etc. As general policy reference books are not issued and these are to be consulted in the library only.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

- ❖ Students are the future of nation. So, they must build up their character first before taking the helm of building the nation
- ❖ Students must be disciplined and polite in their behaviour. They must follow the instruction and guidelines as laid down by the college.

- ❖ They must be punctual and sincere and attend maximum number of classes so that their attendance exceeds the stipulated % of attendance laid down by the university.
- ❖ They must show respect to the teachers and other officials as well as the elder students of the institution.
- ❖ They are advised to create congenial academic environment in the college.
- ❖ The students are expected to maintain cleanliness in their habits and actions. Keeping the college campus clean is their prime responsibility.
- ❖ The students must not loiter in front of the class room unnecessarily when classes are being held.
- ❖ Students should not enter the Principal's chamber, Office and Staff room without any valid reasons.
- ❖ Students should maintain peaceful atmosphere inside the college campus.
- ❖ Students must not indulge in smoking, drinking, etc. inside the premises.
- ❖ Proxy in the college is a serious offence. Any student found guilty must be punished.
- ❖ The College may take disciplinary action against any student for disturbing the academic atmosphere of the college. Discourteous conduct to the teaching or nonteaching staff, damaging or defacing the college property will be treated as serious breach of discipline. Such a student shall not be admitted into the college for further studies and the authority shall not issue a good character certificate to him/ her.

### **ADMISSION POLICY**

Admission to the Degree Course in this college is made on the basis of admission policy framed by the University and the Higher Education. Admission is made purely on merit basis subject to some reservations as prescribed by the Government of West Bengal. After the publication of Higher Secondary results eligible candidates may apply for admission into U.G. Courses through online in the college website (<https://sitanandacollege.ac.in/home.php>) within the stipulated date. ### **CONCESSION OF FEES**

Concession of fees is allowed only to the poor and meritorious students. Besides this, Students' Aid Fund for the needy students has also been created. Direct help to students of Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Religious Minorities in the form of Annual Government Stipend is also provided through college administration.

### **REGISTRATION RULE**

Students are to be registered themselves as per provisions of Vidyasagar University rules within the stipulated date after taking admission into the college. The students have to produce the required documents/testimonials in original at the time of registration. Time Schedule for registration is generally published by the college authority on the Notice Board of the college office in due time for general information to all the students concern. Rules as laid down by Vidyasagar University for registration are strictly followed.

## **STUDENTS' ATTENDANCE RULE**

According to the rules laid down by Vidyasagar University, regular attendance of the students in classes should strictly be maintained. A student must attend 75% of the classes held in the college; otherwise he / she will not be allowed to sit in the final examination as a regular candidate. Rules of attendance are strictly maintained. So, students are advised to remain careful from the very beginning of the session in regard to their attendance.

## **IDENTITY CARD**

The College issues identity card to students after admission, duly signed by the Principal/ Teacher-in-Charge. It contains information about student concerned and it is proof of his / her status as a student of Sitananda College. They are required to keep the card with them during the college hour. The possession of this identity card will entitle him / her to get rightful privilege as a student of Sitananda College. He / she can use it to get all the permissible advantages the college offer to the students. It is to be renewed at the end of each academic year and deposited to the college during the submission of fees for Degree Examination.

## **EDUCATIONAL TOUR AND FIELD WORK**

As per rules of Vidyasagar University, Anthropology, Zoology, Botany, Bengali, Geography and so on, departments are required to take their students on educational tours / Field works related to academic projects in their respective areas. Students studying these subjects at the General and Honours level are required to participate in these programmes and at least one faculty member is compulsorily required to accompany them. The place of Field Work is decided by the respective Department and the expenditure of these is borne partly by the students and partly by the college.

## **EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

The students of the college participate in different extra-curricular activities. This provides an opportunity to unfold their multifarious talents in diverse fields. The college arranges Annual Sports and Cultural Competitions among the students under the supervision of the teachers. The students also celebrate important days in the history of the college and the nation. The students also participate in Inter-college sports meet every year.

## **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

Teachers and students are enthusiastic about creative writing. This results with the Publication of the College Magazine 'Darpan' and Wall Magazine 'Megh Sariye' by the Students' Union under the supervision of the teachers every year. Wall Magazines are also published by different Departments. Students are the principal contributors of the Magazine.

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
		
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
